## Dear Parent/Guardian:

As a parent/guardian of a student in <u>Druid Hills Academy</u>. I am writing this letter to let you know that <u>Druid Hills Academy</u>, has been designated as a Comprehensive Support & Improvement Low-Performing (CSI-LP) school by the North Carolina State Board of Education. As stated in ESSA Section 1111(c)(4)(D)(i), North Carolina had to identify schools for comprehensive support and improvement. CSI-LP schools in North Carolina are those found in the lowest-performing 5 percent of all schools receiving Title I funding. The intent of this opportunity is to improve educational outcomes for all students, close achievement gaps, increase equity, and improve the quality of instruction.

As a CSI-LP school, <u>Druid Hills Academy</u>, is required to develop a comprehensive plan that specifically addresses how the school will improve student achievement. The plan will also include how our district will support us and monitor the progress of our school. The comprehensive plan will address the following areas:

- Classroom Management
- Standard-aligned Instruction
- Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)
- Instructional Leadership
- Recruitment & Retention of Effective Teachers
- Support for Grade-to-Grade Transitions
- Implementation of a Tiered Instructional System
- Data-Driven Decision Making
- Student Support Services
- Family and Community Engagement

We have set the following goals for **Druid Hills Academy** this year:

- The percent of students scoring Grade Level Proficient (GLP) on the Math End of Grade assessments in grades 3-8 will increase from 29.9% in SY 2023-24 to 49.9% in SY 2024-25
- The percent of Kindergarten through 2nd grade students scoring at or above benchmark in early literacy as measured by DIBELS will increase from 70% in SY2023-24 to 80% in SY2024-25.
- The percent of students scoring College and Career Ready (CCR) on reading End of Grade assessments in grades 3-8 will increase from 14.1% in SY2023-24 to 24.1% in SY2024-25.
- The percent of students scoring Grade Level Proficient (GLP) on the Reading End of Grade assessments in grades 3-8 will increase from 31.4% in SY 2023-24 to 46.4% in SY 2024-25

Our students need to experience higher achievement levels, but it will require hard work on the part of staff, students and families. Here are some strategies **Druid Hills Academy** will be implementing:

- Ensuring engaged classrooms with qualified teaching staff
- Monthly parent engagement events
- Use of Parent Square to keep open lines of communication between school and home
- Use data to drive our instructional practices to meet all learning needs

Parent engagement is at the heart of our school improvement efforts. Here are some ways you can help:

- Make sure that both you and your student are aware of academic expectations set for your student this school year. A list of learning objectives in student-friendly language is available from your student's teacher(s).

- Make sure that your student is prepared and attends school each day.
- Monitor the progress your student is making and attend meetings with your student's teacher(s).
