Sexual harassment is so severe, pervasive and objectively offensive that it effectively denies a person equal access to the school's educational program or activity.

- must be sexual in nature
- must have a complainant (voluntary or involuntary)

Just because it relates to a private body part or a bodily function does not mean it falls under Title IX.

Vocabulary involved in Title IX

Complainant: individual who is alleged to be the victim

Respondent: individual reported to be the perpetrator of conduct that could constitute sexual harassment

Formal Complaint: document filed and signed by the complainant or signed by the district Title IX Coordinator alleging sexual harassment against a respondent and requesting an investigation of the alleged sexual harassment.

Supportive Measures are provided to ensure equal educational access, protect safety or deter sexual harassment **and** are non-punitive, non-disciplinary, and not unduly burdensome to the other party.

Examples include but are not limited to

- counseling
- restorative conferences
- schedule changes during the investigation
- academic supports
- no contact agreement
- seating assignment changes
- referral to outside agency including law enforcement
