Dear Parent/Guardian,

Legislation (G.S. §115C-83.15) passed during the 2013 long session of the North Carolina General Assembly provides parents with an additional measure of school performance in the form of School Performance Grades. Beginning with the 2013–14 school year, the annual North Carolina School Report Cards display a letter grade of A, B, C, D, or F for each school in the state.

The School Performance Grades are based 80 percent on our school's achievement score (student proficiency) and 20 percent on students' academic growth. At Stoney Creek Elementary School, our achievement score for the 2022-2023 school year is based on how well our students performed on Grade 3-5 Mathematics, Grades 3–5 English Language Arts/Reading, and Grades 5 Science.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that Stoney Creek Elementary has been designated as a low performing school by the North Carolina State Board of Education. As defined in G.S. 115C-105.37: "The State Board of Education shall identify low-performing schools on an annual basis. Low-performing schools are those that earn an overall school performance grade of D or F and a school growth score of "met expected growth" or "not met expected growth" as defined by G.S. 115C-83.15."

Stoney Creek Elementary School received a School Performance Grade of D and a growth designation of Did Not Meet for the 2023–2024 school year. Although we are committed to improving this score, it is important to remember that just as no one single score or grade tells the whole story of a student, neither does it tell you everything about the performance of a school or the opportunities that our school provides.

- We are a **Positive Behavior Intervention and Support school (PBIS)**. PBIS is a data-driven school-wide initiative for improving social competence and academic achievement for all students. As a PBIS school we focus on character education, universal expectations across the school for student procedures and behavior, and rewarding positive behavior.
- We utilize an incentives program to recognize students who exhibit positive behavior that align with the school's Essential Five
- Students in grades K-3 increased reading proficiency by 6 percentage points during the 2023-2024 school year per mClass data.
- Students in grade 5 increased proficiency by nearly 10 percentage points compared to the previous year

As a low performing school, we are required to develop an improvement plan that specifically addresses how the school will improve both the school performance grade and school growth score. The plan will also include how the superintendent and other central office administrators in the district will work with us and monitor the progress of our school. We are already engaged in the work of refining our plan and will present the plan to our school board at their next meeting on October 8, 2024 at the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East Fourth Street, Charlotte, NC 28202 where the plan will be presented for approval. One of our top priorities for 2024–2025 is to improve our School Performance Grade. There are a number of key programs we have in place to help improve student performance. These include:

- The school has hired three tutors to support targeted small group support in reading based on data.
- The school has hired an MTSS Interventionist to provide targeted reading support based on data
- The school has hired a reading teacher to provide targeted reading support based on data
- The school implements WIN time so students may engage in activities that support enrichment or remediation
- The school has hired a Beginning Teacher Coach to support beginning teachers

We hope you will closely follow your student's academic progress and work with his or her teacher(s) to help ensure they stay on track academically. Working together as a team, we can improve not only how well our students are performing individually, but how our school is performing as a whole. There is nothing more important to administrators and teachers at Stoney Creek Elementary School than ensuring students are ready for the next step in their academic careers. I look forward to working with you to make sure your student is on track for success.
