A Look at Library Lessons



Kindergarten - Second

Students closed out the unit on learning library etiquette and how to behave in the library by listening to the read aloud story, "Do Not Bring a Dragon into the Library," by Julie Gassman.

Currently, our younger scholars have been learning about Community Helpers and what it means to serve and help others. So far, students have learned about dentists, veterinarians, and construction workers. By listening to read alouds and also sharing their own experiences, students have been deeply engaged in the lesson!

\*Builds vocabulary


\*Improves writing skills

### Author Highlight


Author: R.L. Stine
