Good afternoon Hornet Families,

Dr. Rebecca Lee Crumpler made history in 1864 when she became the first Black woman to receive a medical degree in the United States, graduating from the New England Female Medical College. This pioneering achievement laid the foundation for future generations of Black women in medicine. However, progress has been slow. As of 2018, Black women represented only 2.8% of physicians in the United States, despite making up 6.4% of the total population. In 2020, Forbes magazine highlighted the voices of several Black female doctors, shedding light on their experiences and challenges in the medical field. Despite the challenges, many Black women continue to pursue careers in medicine, inspired by trailblazers like Dr. Crumpler.

ARMS is excited to report progress being made on Benchmark 2 in reading. Across each grade level, student proficiency increased on Benchmark 2 and that makes us very proud! In math and science, we experienced a slight decline and will continue working to increase proficiency in all three areas. The next Benchmark will be in April. Please be sure your child is at school, completing assignments, and studying at home each night to help us exceed our goals for proficiency this year.
