March 1 kicked off Women's History Month and we are excited to recognize Claudette Colvin who, now 85 years old, is a remarkable pioneer of the American Civil Rights Movement and whose courage and determination deserve celebration. On this day in history in 1955 at the age of 15, Colvin boldly refused to give up her seat on the bus in Montgomery, Alabama. This was nine months before Rosa Parks' more famous act of defiance. Claudette Colvin's brave stand against segregation led to her arrest and ultimately made her one of the key plaintiffs in the landmark case Browder v. Gayle, which ruled bus segregation unconstitutional. Despite being overlooked for many years, Colvin's actions were instrumental in sparking the Montgomery Bus Boycott and advancing the civil rights movement. Montgomery declared today, March 2, as Claudette Colvin Day in 2017. Colvin's unwavering spirit and commitment to justice at such a young age serve as an inspiring example of the power of individual action in the face of systemic oppression.
