Daily Class Attendance is Mandatory

- Class attendance is taken daily
- Students are allowed **10** unexcused absences per class
- Lockout is an unexcused absence
- 11 or more unexcused absences results in a *F* for the class

- Student reports to lockout for the remainder of first block
- Parent is notified
- Student is expected to work on class assignments and adhere to rules of the Lockout Room
- Students are marked as an unexcused absence

Transition to Classes LATE is an Unexcused ABSENCE

- Students have <u>7</u> minutes to transition to classes.
- (1 min. warning)
- Teacher doors are closed after the late bell
- Students should report immediately to lockout if not in class when the tardy bell rings
- Failure to report immediately to Lockout will result in consequences.
- Students sit in lockout for the duration of the class
- Parents are notified of student lockouts
- Failure to report immediately to Lockout will result in consequences

Hall Passes and Restroom Policy

- Hall passes are required at all times when not in class.
- No passes are granted 15 min. after the tardy bell and 15 min before transition.
- No restroom passes are issued the first 15 minutes after lunch.
- Restrooms are open on all three floors.
- Closed restrooms should not be accessed at any time.
- All restroom are monitored by staff.
- Abuse of restroom breaks have consequences.



CMS District Dress Code

- Shirts must cover the entire upper body (when arms are raised)
- Graphic shirts & shoes must be appropriate (No abusive language, slogans, illegal drug symbols)
- Pants must cover the lower portion of the body (tears should be a minimum of skin exposure and not show upper thigh)
- Skirts and dresses must cover mid-thigh
- No hoods, masks, hats, shades, etc. preventing identification
- No pajamas, loungewear, bedroom slippers, blankets, stuffed animals
- No Bodysuits, Onesies
- Address clothing or sit in ISS

Discipline and Long-term Loss of Privileges

Participation in extracurricular activities is a privilege, not a right. It is the policy of Palisades High School that student behavior, including conduct that constitutes a violation of criminal law, board policy and/or school rules, shall be considered in determining eligibility to participate in extracurricular activities at Palisades High School.

A student at Palisades High School shall be ineligible from participation in extracurricular activities under the following circumstances:

- →Misdemeanor Charges
- →Out-of-School Suspension
 - (5 or more days)
- →Other Misconduct





Cell Phone & Electronics Policy

- According to CMS policy, the district is not responsible for theft, loss, or damage to PTDs or other electronic devices brought onto CMS property.
- Students are not to charge PTDs at any point during the school day.
- **Cell phones** are collected and stored in each class and redistributed at end of class
- Students may not use their cell phones, at any time, to make phone calls, record incidents/fights.
- **No earbuds and bluetooth speakers** are allowed during the official school day between 7:15AM -2:15PM.

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is a college readiness system and class taken each year at Palisades High School that assists students in preparing to meet the demands of university requirements and to successfully graduate from college.

Students in AVID take the Honors AVID Elective Class each year they are in high school. The skills and knowledge learned and utilized will allow them to become

An application is required to enroll in this course.



- Broken or lost devices and chargers should be reported and replaced immediately.





Drivers must adhere to staff and cones for ALL directions at ALL times






PHS TRAFFIC PLAN (ARRIVAL)


