We schedule our family engagement events based on this feedback. We will be hosting 3 report card pick up events, where parents will have time during the entire school day to schedule a parent conference with their child's teacher.

School performance data is shared with parents via the school report card. Individual student assessment reports are sent home with students quarterly. During spring and fall curriculum nights parents are informed about the various ways their child will be assessed throughout the school year. During curriculum night proficiency expectations are also shared with families. Interpreters are secured for all school events to ensure all parents are able to access the information. The SIT is composed of 5 parent stakeholders and meeting dates are available on the school website. Parent engagement surveys are administered twice a year. Feedback from surveys are used to drive current and future parent engagement events.

Reid Park Academy hosts 4 parent empowerment events over the course of the school year. During each of these events parents are provided with information about assessments, curriculum, homework expectations, and strategies to continue the learning process at home. The school has partnered with ShermCo for the purpose of strengthening attendance at parent empowerment events and increasing parent engagement. The principal sends a biweekly communication to families informing them of upcoming events. Principal and teachers regularly post information to ParentSquare. School information (report cards, assessment data, newsletters) is sent home in Thursday folders. Information is translated as needed. RPA worked with a community partner to assemble a parent resource room.
