What is a Title I school?

Title I is the largest federally funded educational program. A Title I school is a school receiving federal funds for students. The basic principle of Title I is that schools with large concentrations of low-income students receive supplemental funds to meet students' educational goals.

Proud Points

- ★ DHA consistently builds a culture of caring, support, and focus on academic growth.
- ★ DHA has strong community partnerships with Blythe, St. Peter's, UNCC/Delta Sigma Sorority Incorporated, Myers Park United Methodist, Coca Cola Incorporated, Optimist Club, Urban League of NC, Second Harvest, Classroom Central, Druid Hills OG, and MORE. They provide so much support for our students and staff: student prizes, staff incentives, snacks, dojo store items, spirit wear, lunches, field trips, tutoring support, and SO much more!
- ★ We have decreased our chronic absenteeism by 15%.
- Our students are filled with JOY and a LOVE of learning!
- ★ We have the BEST staff in CMS & North Carolina!



MORE PROUD POINTS OF DATA

- School performance grade went from an F to a D in ONE year! NO MORE F scores!!!
- ★ For the first time in TEN year, we EXCEEDED growth in our overall performance 2023-24.
- ★ Our K-2 scholars overall increased our growth from BOY to EOY by 20% + in each grade
 - K went from BOY of 35% to EOY of 79%
 - \circ 1st went from BOY of 30 to EOY of 48%
 - 2nd went from BOY of 28% to EOY of 48%
- ★ Grades 3rd 8th increased GLP across all subjects by 16.6% (from 16.3% to 32.9% GLP)
- ★ We made the HIGHEST growth in ELA across ALL schools in CMS
- ★ We made the SECOND HIGHEST growth in Math across ALL schools in CMS
- ★ We made the **FIFTH HIGHEST growth** in Science across ALL schools in CMS
- ★ Our growth index was a +6.9% with 0 being the baseline of showing "expected growth" number ELEVEN out of 186 schools
- No longer on the list labeled "LOW performing" in North Carolina!

What does it mean to be a Title I School?

- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for the following:
 - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help students meet the state's challenging content standards.

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- Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
- Conducting parent and family engagement meetings/trainings/activities
- Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly-Qualified Teachers

How are Title I funds used in our school?

<u>A snapshot of how we are spending federal dollars to ensure</u> <u>excellence at DHA(approx. \$400,000)</u>:

- ★ 3 teachers
- ★ 1 BMT
- ★ $1\frac{1}{2}$ Teacher Assistants
- ★ 1 tutor
- ★ TLP stipends (MCLs, EIT 3s, EIT 2s)
- ★ Extended employment for curriculum development/planning beyond the school day/hours (summer, Saturday, after school)
- ★ Supplies and materials for classrooms(so parents do not have to send in school supplies to use in class)
- ★ Field Trips to eliminate the bulk of cost to parents

What is the 1% set-aside and how are parents involved?

- Any Local Education Agency (LEA) or school district with a Title I Allocation exceeding \$500,000 is required by law to set aside 1% of the Title I allocation for parent and family engagement.
- Of that 1%, 10% may be reserved at the LEA/district level for system-wide initiatives related to parent and family engagement. The remaining 90% must be allocated to all Title I schools in the district. In CMS, each Title I school receives its portion of the 90% to implement school-level parent and family engagement activities and events
- Title I parents have the right to provide input into decisions regarding how this money is spent. This process is completed through the School Improvement Team (SIT)

Why are we here?

The *Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA),* as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015, requires that each Title I School hold an Annual Meeting for parents/families/community members for the purpose of:

- Informing you of your school's participation in Title I services
- Explaining the requirements of Title I, Part A
- Explaining your rights as parents to be engaged
